"How would you like to have your private affairs transacted through your next door neighbor?" asked Miss Letitia Pyfe in her talk on the Americanization of foreign-born women Thursday before the University Y. W. C. A.

"Because the workers among foreign-born women did not know the languages of the people among whom they were working," she said, "it was once necessary to work with either a neighbor or a small child as interpreter."

"Americanization work does not mean trying to make the foreign-born or children of foreign-born women ashamed of the country from which they come."

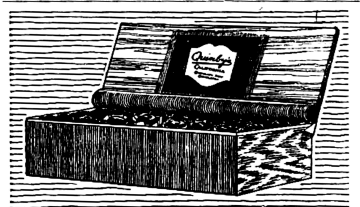
